



SOSS'S YOUNGEST SPONSOR EXPLAINS WHY HE SUPPORTS A REFUGEE'S EDUCATION

My name is Wyatt Terry. I am a 16 year old sophomore at The Kent Denver School. I first learned about SOSS when I was 11. My aunt and uncle had previously sponsored South Sudanese refugees. One of them, Joseph Khot, moved to Colorado after serving in the Army. Joseph and Arok Garang were friends, and Joseph introduced my family and me to Arok. Upon learning that Arok was starting a non-profit, we signed up for the newsletter and, when we received an invitation to attend the first annual luncheon for SOSS, I was really excited to go.

As my parents were unable to attend I needed to arrange for my own transportation. Thankfully Joseph offered to take me and we attended the luncheon together. I was inspired by the presentations and wanted to help Arok achieve his vision; I wanted to make a difference. It was at that moment that I landed on the idea of supporting a student for the entirety of his or her education.

Immediately I started thinking about how to raise significant money for SOSS. My first idea was to collect sponsorships for my participation in athletic events. During my first three years of SOSS support, I raised a little over \$4,000 dollars by bicycling and running events, including the Leadville 10k. It was often grueling and painful – but I was motivated knowing that my efforts were ultimately going to help a child across the globe.

In my most recent year I decided to fund my sponsorship with my own money. In order to meet this goal, I started an entrepreneurial business

offering my services for dog walks, yard work and other household chores. All together I have raised around \$5,500 dollars. I am very proud that this money has gone towards my support of Dut Chol Atem. In the future I would like to increase my involvement in SOSS. Now that I can drive I hope to lend a hand in the office, on social media, or anywhere else my skillset can be utilized. Ultimately I would like to travel to Kenya, meet Dut Chol and teach a summer at Roots Academy where I could experience first hand the thrill of sharing the gift of education. No doubt what I would receive in return would be every bit as rewarding.

I again thank Arok and the SOSS family for providing me with the opportunity to better myself while helping change lives of those who have so much to offer if given the chance.

KIDS CAMP FUNDS BRING WATER TO SOUTH SUDANESE REFUGEES

Some 50,000 South Sudanese refugees now have fresh water, thanks to Arvada Covenant Kids Camp. The campers raised \$17,000 in 2012 to build a water well in Arok's hometown of Paliau, South Sudan. Due to the Civil War, it was neither safe nor feasible to build the well in South Sudan. However, a large refugee camp operates just over the border in Ethiopia, which cares for a large number of refugees, most from South Sudan.

SoSS volunteers Tom Melander and Arok Garang worked with Serve Globally, the mission arm of the Evangelical Covenant Church (denomination headquarters for Arvada Covenant), to build the well to benefit both the refugees and local residents of Gambella, Ethiopia. Two wells were built: a shallow well, which became operational in December, and a deeper well dug soon after. Rev. Abraham Tuach, former president of the Evangelical Covenant Church of South Sudan in Ethiopia, spoke at the dedication.
