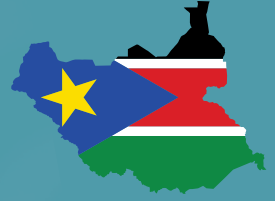

Home Base FUND-RAISING SUCCEEDS!

Thanks to many donors, large and small, Seeds of South Sudan has raised sufficient funds to purchase Home Base in Nakuru, Kenya. The property includes a large family home in a secure part of Nakuru, surrounded by a high wall. The SoSS Kenya staff live at Home Base year-round and students live there in April, August and December – the three months that Kenyan schools are on break. The five 2017 high school graduates also live at Home Base while they await funding to receive

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Special Thanks to Arvada Covenant Church, which raised \$146,196 for the purchase of Home Base, over 66% of the total raised from all sources. Your constant and reliable generosity is a blessing that is the foundation of our success. In addition, the 2018 Arvada Covenant Kids Camp raised \$8,865 to purchase additional beds, mattresses, blankets, new uniforms and serving utensils for the 17 new students who joined SoSS this year.



The large courtyard at Home Base in Nakuru is a gathering place for meals, games and meetings. Aguil Deng and Yar Deng sit on one of the many bunk beds that have been purchased to accommodate our 90+ students when they are all home from school. Yar and Aguil both attend Roots Academy.

Mr. Arok Garang came in to share his incredible story and to inform Integrated English and Social Studies students about events that changed his life. He also spoke about Seeds of South Sudan to tell students how they could help Sudanese kids earn an education. He believes education is very important and that “dedication is very powerful.”

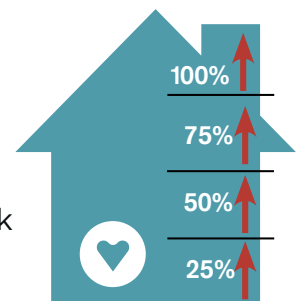
“It’s cool that he could come and talk to our class because it shows what he was going through,” says freshman Bailee Bebernes. “It gives us a better view of what it was really like for him rather than just reading books and watching videos about it. I think that it sheds light on how big and how current this event really is.”

Students asked questions about Arok’s education, his life in South Sudan, and the struggles as he came to America.

“Mrs. Mackey and I hope that our students gain an appreciation for the world beyond themselves,” said history teacher Rachel Hofmann. “We have so many opportunities and privileges, including a public education. People like our guest speaker, Arok, have not had it as easy but are still doing amazing things... We also hope they can learn about resilience and the power of the human spirit. The Lost Boys of Sudan embody these qualities and we are so glad Arok is willing to share his story with our 9th graders who are so excited to meet him.”

new SoSS SCHOLARs BEGIN STUDIES AT ROOTS academy

Twelve more refugee orphans left the Kakuma Refugee Camp in April and started school at Roots Academy in May 2018. That brings to 17 the number of students who have been sponsored and started school since our Colorado team visited Kakuma in July 2017 and interviewed 45 students. Thank you to our generous sponsors for paying the cost of their education at Roots Academy. Now these four girls and eight boys receive three meals a day and a high-quality education that will help prepare them to become leaders in South Sudan.
