# THREE SEEDS **SCHOLARS COMPETE** FOR SCHOLARSHIPS IN CANADA

Three of our newest high school graduates achieved B+ scores on their Kenyan graduation exam, high enough to qualify to compete for coveted full-ride scholarships to Canada. Deng Mading Anhiany, Yar Deng Mayen and Aleer Thuch Kuir have traveled to Kakuma Refugee Camp to attend a series of interviews and tests for the scholarship. It takes about a year to determine who gets the scholarships and some luck is involved because there are more candidates than slots.

Seeds has five students who have earned scholarships in Canada. One, John Matiop, has graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree. Our Seeds graduates did better than most Kenyans on their graduation exam. The B+ grade puts these three scholars in the elite 2% of 958,911 students in Kenya taking the exam.

Seeds celebrates the graduation of 17 high school students in 2024, the largest number ever of our South Sudanese refugee orphans! Eleven of the 17 high school graduates have traveled to South Sudan for a year to volunteer in areas safe from violence. Below are the students by high school. Photos of three of the grads are on the front page and the rest are below. Note: In South Sudan, many parents name their boys after grandfathers and their girls after grandmothers, leading to many children having similar names.

Our newest high school graduates, listed by high school, are:

Aleer Kuir Thuch, Mamer Deng Chol and Aleer Thuch Kuir have graduated from Ringa Boys High School. Deng Lual Deng and Deng Mading Anhiany graduated from Agoro Sare Boys HS.

Aleer Jok Atem and Marol Deng Ghak graduated from Koelel Boys High School. Deng Mapior Thuch graduated from Naivasha Boys HS. Aleer Deng Chol graduated from Nakuru Boys HS. Other graduates are Barach Machar Jok, Maghai Thiong Thuch and Thon Dhieu Deng.

Seeds is eternally grateful for the faithful sponsors who have supported these students for many years. They will make a huge difference in helping to repair their fragile country.

































### MARIN CATHOLIC AND KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS MAKE MAJOR GRANT TO SEEDS

A parochial high school and a Knights of Columbus chapter in Marin County north of San Francisco are making a major grant to Seeds of South Sudan that will help cover tuition and expenses for several of our unsponsored students. Marin Catholic High School and the Knights of Columbus San Rafael #307 are donating more than \$27,000.

"The St. Vincent DePaul Club (SVdP) at Marin Catholic High School conducts a fund drive during Lent to help a particular nonprofit," said Joe Tassone, a 30-year teacher at Marin Catholic. The drive includes a walka-thon and students contribute through a theology class every day in Lent, with a competition between classes to see which group raises the most money. This year, the cash donated by students totaled \$6,881 and checks from teachers totaled \$1,620. They decided to donate the proceeds to Seeds.

A fund-raiser by Knights of Columbus to benefit education in Africa raised \$15,000. That donation will benefit Seeds as well. The Knights also raised \$3,800 through a dinner this year. Joe Tassone learned of Seeds of South Sudan from longtime supporter Pastor Heidi McGinniss, who worked with Tassone while she assisted a Swiss Human Rights organization, Christian Solidarity International, and the South Sudanese Underground Railroad that brought thousands of enslaved Sudanese home over 14 years. Keer Deng, who was freed through CSI's efforts, accompanied the MC students for his third walk-a-thon appearance.

Three Seeds high school students who have lost their sponsors will benefit. The grant will support Thiong Dau Atem, a senior at St. Joseph's Boys School and Yar Machar Jok, who will graduate from Jomo Kenvatta Girls High school. Grant funds will also support Nak Machar Jok, who is a sophomore at St. Joseph High School in Kenya, through his last three years of high school.

The balance of this generous grant will support other college students whose costs are not fully covered due to increases in housing and food costs in Nairobi because our kids can no longer live and eat in the dorms.
